FROM STATELESS TO CITIZEN

MANUEL GIL'S PORTRAITS OF STATELESS SUBJECTS AND MEMBERS OF THEIR FAMILIES WERE MADE IN CONJUNCTION WITH DR. ÓSCAR GIL-GARCÍA'S WORK WITH INDIGENOUS GUATEMALANS WHO HAVE LIVED IN CHIAPAS, MEXICO, FOR OVER THIRTY YEARS WITHOUT OFFICIAL STATUS. DR. GIL-GARCÍA'S COLLABORATIONS WITH THESE INDIGENOUS COMMUNITIES AND LEGAL EXPERTS LED TO ALL OF THE STATELESS REFUGEES IN THE PROJECT RECEIVING CITIZENSHIP IN MEXICO; YET, UP TO DATE, ABOUT TWENTY-SEVEN THOUSAND GUATEMALAN REFUGEES REMAIN STATELESS IN MEXICO.
