Established on the Canisius College campus in 1986, the Western New York Writing Project is an affiliate of the National Writing Project, a nationwide education program that works to improve student writing and thinking. Our goal is to improve the teaching of writing in Western New York's schools. The WNYWP is part of an ever-expanding national network of 200 writing project sites across the United States.

Each summer, the WNYWP identifies exemplary teachers of writing from all subject areas and grade levels. These teachers attend an intensive Summer Institute focused on the teaching of writing across the curriculum. They present demonstration writing lessons, study most current literacy research, write extensively, and share their writing.

During the school year, the Western New York Writing Project delivers professional development programs in area school districts and hosts a variety of continuing education programs for teachers.

The Western New York Writing Project also conducts several programs for young writers in grades K-12.
