



Teen Writing Workshop for grades 8-12+ Young Writers' Camp for grades 3-7

summer writing workshops

TEEN WRITING WORKSHOP GRADES 8-12+ July 8-18, 9:30am-1:00pm Final Reception July 19, 5-7pm

In the Teen Writing Workshop, the focus is on creative writing. A workshop for motivated writers, students spend time each day with writing groups. There, they share their writing and grow from the guidance of their peers and mentor teachers.

Participants benefit from a number of other activities, including visits from local authors, open mic sessions each week, and creating a print and audio anthology to publish their work.

> YOUNG WRITERS' CAMP GRADES 3-7 July 8-18, 9:00am-12:30pm Final Reception July 19, 9:00-10:30am

Each year, the Young Writers' Camp is organized around a theme. In 2013, the summer's theme is *exploring nature*. Like the Teen Writing Workshop, the focus of the camp is to develop its participants' creative writing skills.

During the two weeks of camp, campers will work together both in small groups and individually to develop interesting and thoughtful pieces of writing. They will write poetry, mini-dramas, stories, songs, and more. In addition, the Young Writers always make videos during camp. The videos will be shown at the final reception.

This year, our field trip will be to the Tifft Nature Preserve (<u>http://www.sciencebuff.org/</u> <u>tifft-nature-preserve/</u>) on Thursday, July 11.



Cost: \$225 per student (\$250 if you register after July 1, 2013)

The cost of attending includes a t-shirt, bag/backpack, a composition book, and any additional supplies.

A limited number of partial (\$100) need-based scholarships are available. To apply, include a letter explaining your need by **June 14, 2013**. Out of fairness, an attendee may only receive a scholarship once during his or her tenure with the Workshops.
