PROGRAM DESCRIPTION AND PRESENTER BIOGRAPHY

Presentation Title: A Trauma Focused Approach to Helping Children, Adolescents, and Families

Abstract: The ability to demonstrate efficacy, competence and knowledge when working with and counseling children, adolescents and families who have either experienced *past* trauma or *current* trauma is critical for mental health professionals. This counseling seminar is designed to provide participants with the following: 1) a comprehensive and thorough overview of assessment procedures; 2) an introduction of the most noted empirically-based treatment techniques and interventions utilized in trauma-focused approaches; 3) effective counseling approaches to incorporate in efforts to help children, adolescents, and families understand the process of trauma treatment; and 4) clinical implications for mental health professionals who incorporate a trauma-focused approach with families. This counseling seminar is relevant and pertinent for all mental health professionals, including graduate students.

Presenter: Lisa A. Murawski, LMHC, CCMHC, NCC, is a Licensed Mental Health Counselor, Certified Clinical Mental Health Counselor, and National Certified Counselor currently in private practice in Williamsville, NY. She has vast experience with children and adolescents with emotional, behavioral, and significant mental health issues. Lisa has experience in a variety of settings from volunteer opportunities, mentoring, inpatient units, day school settings, day treatment settings, residential treatment centers, and outpatient settings.
